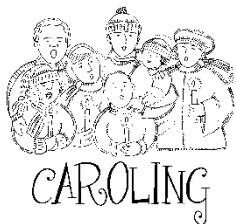

Sometimes the need for ministry gives little warning. Who would have thought that a foot of snow would fall in October and we moderns would need to do without electricity for a week or so? It was bad enough without our internet and television, but no light or heat either and for many of us no phones!

Well, if you were a member or friend of First Church, support is here! First of all, the church never lost electricity! For some reason, the way the electrical grid is designed, this southwest corner of the intersection of Connecticut Boulevard and Main Street was an oasis of power; power of two types really, electrical and spiritual, neither of which can be seen but both of which can be so surely felt.

So some of our members fired up the stove and oven in our just-renovated-in-time-kitchen, and up to forty others brought food that was quickly thawing and warming at home, and they all shared it together! For the entire outage week, lunch and dinner could be had at the church for anyone who came, bring what you would or could, and sit and get warm for a while and eat with your friends. It might remind us of the depiction of the first generation church in ancient Jerusalem where in the book of Acts it is recorded that they—

All...were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and would

Our church building also served as an overnight shelter for a few of our members and friends who just wanted a warm place to spend the night. There was no turning anyone away from this inn!

But what about communication? With phones down and even cell phone use unavailable in the first days after the storm, was everyone doing okay or did anyone need help? Well, if people could not be called on the phone then some people of the church made visits to make sure our aging and home bound members were making it alright!

What a privilege to be the pastor of such a congregation! We all hear the accusation that the church in general is just made up of hypocrites who say one thing and do another. And I admit that we are not perfect, not any of us, but how good we were when Alfred tore our trees and wires apart! And how much love and care is shared among us each day!

Give me church people every time!
